

HOUSEHOLD PETS

The Household Pet comes in all colours and combination of colours. Coat lengths may be short and sleek, full and fluffy, any combination of these, or somewhere in between. Tails may be long, short, kinky or non-existent. Eye colour may or may not be coordinated with the coat colour according to the whims of Mother Nature. All coat colour and eye colours, coat and tail lengths shall be acceptable. The most important consideration is overall condition, well fed and altered (8 months and over). A Household Pet seems to smile with good health and contentment.

BEAUTY

These points shall be assigned according to the taste of the individual judge. Judges notice pleasing markings, colours and patterns. Overall grace and balance are often factors to be considered in determining beauty.

PERSONALITY

Alert, friendly and easy to handle. Allowance may be made for nervousness due to unfamiliarity with shows. If a cat must be removed from the cage by the handler and is then fully amenable to being handled by the Judge, no penalty shall be attached.

CONDITION

COAT – Absolutely clean and free of any trace of matts or parasites. Well groomed. Pleasant appearance and feel. Eyes, ears, nose, mouth and claws must be clean. Eyes and nose must be free of any matter. CLAWS MUST BE CLIPPED.

BALANCE & PROPORTION

Nicely proportioned. A small head on a large cat or vice versa would be somewhat disproportionate. Proper weight for its size. Overweight or underweight shall both be considered undesirable. Muscle tone to be sound. Some allowances may be made for older Household Pets.

APPARENT PUREBRED HOUSEHOLD PETS

Household Pets of apparent purebred background shall be judged exactly the same as all other Household Pets. They shall be neither penalized nor rewarded solely on the basis of their resemblance to one of the recognized breeds.

COLOUR

Recognized in all colours and patterns.

CONSIDERATIONS

Physical anomalies not allowed by most purebred standards shall be acceptable for the Household Pet. No penalty shall be attached for crossed eyes, kinked tail, extra toes or the like. As many Household Pets are deemed strays, there shall be no penalty attached to such physical damage unless it appears the problem is an ongoing one indicating lack of care.

WITHHOLD AWARDS

- * If cat is dirty or in poor condition.
- * Unable to handle.
- * Lacking claws.

HOUSEHOLD PET JUDGING AND AWARDS

Upon initial evaluation by the judge each household pet can be awarded either a 1st ribbon (red) or depending on the club — an Award of Merit ribbon (any colour).

When the judge has finished evaluating all the Household Pets, the judge will choose ten cats for final awards and rosettes. There must be 15 household pets entered in the show in order to give top 10 final placements (otherwise the number of finalists will be 5). The judge will also designate their Best and 2nd Best Companion, and their Best and 2nd Best Grand Companion.
